THE VULNERABILITY OF SMALL BUSINESSES IN TIMES OF CRISIS

Small and medium-sized enterprises have a key role in the functioning of local, regional and national economies. SMEs are the backbone of the economy and before the pandemic they generated more than half of the European Union's Gross Domestic Product.
