## Between Anvils and Hammers: The Danube Basin Security Environment in the 21st Century

After the collapse of the Soviet Union and in most cases of the communist dictatorships, the security environment of the Danube basin states has changed. Some of the states on the Eastern part of the basin ceased to exist, civil wars started, and an overall economic depression threatened the newly forming republics. Yet, with time, most of the nations in the region joined the EU and/or the NATO and could more or less build a stable democracy and achieve respectable economic growth.
